...EVANS APPOINTS TACOMAN TO BOARD OF TRUSTEES... Governor <u>Daniel J. Evans</u> has announced the appointment of Tacoman <u>Thomas Dixon</u> to the Evergreen Board of Trustees, replacing <u>Al Saunders</u>, who retired in December. Dixon, Executive Director of the Tacoma Urban League, will take office immediately. The 42-year-old Tacoman is a retired Air Force man who received his bachelor of science degree in history and government from Sophia University, Tokyo, Japan in 1960. He has a master's degree in urban studies from the University of Puget Sound. A former counselor for the Tacoma Employment Security/Youth Opportunity Center, Dixon has also served as executive director of the Hilltop-Multi-Service Center, an organization sponsored by the Office of Economic Opportunity, and has served as the Governor's Minority Employment Consultant.

...MCCANN EXPLAINS EVERGREEN CREDIT TRANSFERABILITY TO PRESS... President Charles J. McCann held a press conference Feb. 28 to explain questions which had arisen regarding the transferability of Evergreen credits. In a "White Paper" issued to the press, high school and college counselors, principals, and newspaper editors, all student admissions applicants and members of the Evergreen community, McCann pointed out that 286 students have requested transcripts be issued to other colleges and universities. All transcripts have been fully accepted. McCann also told reporters about Evergreen's accreditation standing. And, he observed that the track record of Evergreen graduates in securing jobs or admission to graduate schools is "short but very encouraging."

McCann met with several hundred Evergreeners Feb.27 to clarify Evergreen's position and explain his testimony before the Senate Ways and Means Committee. The committee considered the college's 1973-75 operating and capital budget requests during a Feb. 26 hearing.

- ...EIGHT NOMINEES FOR DEAN LISTED...Eight faculty members have accepted nominations for the position of Dean and Associate Dean for the 1973-74 academic year. Those being considered are Larry Eickstaedt, Cruz Esquivel, Rudy Martin, Carol Olexa, Mark Papworth, Willie Parson, Lynn Patterson and Sid White. A decision is expected by Provost Ed Kormondy on the deanships by the end of March.
- ...EVERGREEN TEAM HELPING DRAFT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR TWO COUNTIES...A team of students and faculty members has been designated to help draft a comprehensive mental health and retardation plan for Cowlitz and Wahkiakum Counties in Southwest Washington. The project was given formal approval Feb. 27 by the Cowlitz County Commission. The contractual agreement calls for the Evergreen team of two faculty members and three students to do an exhaustive community survey, analyze the data, draft a set of planning recommendations and develop an action model for short and long-range implementation. Students will receive academic credit for their work. The project --- set up through the auspices of the Cowlitz-Wahkiakum County Coordinating Board for Mental Health, Mental Retardation, Alcoholism and Drug Abuse --- is scheduled to be completed by mid-May.
- ...JANUARY INTERNSHIP REPORT --- 213 ON THE JOB...The Office of Cooperative Education reports 126 students are on full-time internships this quarter, with an additional 87 students working on part-time assignments. Forty-seven faculty members are serving as intern sponsors along with 11 staff members. A total monthly income of \$17,359 is being earned by the 57 paid interns.
- ... "THE STUDENT AT EVERGREEN" FEATURED IN MAR.1 SYMPOSIUM... The Evergreen Symposium, the new monthly campus magazine, zeroes in on "The Student at Evergreen" in its second publication which hit the stands Mar. 1. The magazine, on sale at the college bookstore, features articles by a cross-section of the Evergreen community, including faculty, staff, students and administrators.
