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The first showing of the Washington Printmakers Collection, which contains some 50 art prints gathered by The Evergreen State College from works of state master printmakers and their students, will begin April 21 in conjunction with the college's Dedication/Inauguration ceremonies.

The special exhibit will be on display in the Evergreen Art Gallery--fourth floor of the Daniel J. Evans Library Building--through May 12 and may be viewed free of charge. Hours of gallery operation are from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. weekdays and from 12:00 noon to 5:00 p.m. week ends.

The Printmakers Collection covers a wide range of printmaking Techniques, including collographs, lithographs, etchings, seriographs, etc. The various prints have been framed and made suitable for showings not only at Evergreen but also at other locations in Washington.

Printmaker-teachers and their protegees last year submitted two of their most recent works of art for selection by a special committee headed by Evergreen faculty member Sid White. The college then purchased 50 prints for inclusion in the library collection and for traveling display.
