The struggle of the nation's Mexico-Latin immigrants will be explored in an all day mini-conference scheduled April 8 at The Evergreen State College.

Offered to inform interested citizens and students of the working rights of immigrants, the day-long session will feature a morning panel discussion, an afternoon talk, and two theatrical performances.

The rights of undocumented workers will be discussed in the morning session beginning at 10 o'clock in Lecture Hall One. Panelists include Juan Solis, director of the Seattle-based La Raza Law Students; Theodore Goodwin, member of the National Lawyers Guild, and Arturo Gonzalez, coordinator of the Seattle Coalition for Fair Immigration Laws and Practice.

The plight of those same workers will be discussed by Felipe Aquirre, national coordinator for the Coalition on Immigration Laws and Practice, Friday afternoon, beginning at 1:30 in the Evans Library lobby.

Performances by two Los Angeles theater groups will conclude the free public conference. The Teatro Movimiento Primavera will present a play on the undocumented worker called "Jacobo," followed by a mime performance by the Teatro Obrero troupe.

The conference is sponsored by Evergreen's Third World Coalition, Mecha, the Coalition for Fair Immigration Laws and Practice, and the Center for Autonomous Social Action (CASA).
