Anthony Ostroff, poet and professor of English at Portland's Lewis and Clark College, will read selections of his works in a free public performance February 11 at 8 p.m. in the third floor Library lounge of The Evergreen State College.

Ostroff, former Lewis and Clark vice president for academic affairs and dean of the faculty, has published more than 150 articles, short stories and poems in a wide variety of journals, including Atlantic Monthly, Harper's and the New Yorker.

His works have been included in 20 books and anthologies, and he has written three books: Three Self Evaluations, published by Beloit in 1953; Imperatives, published by Harcourt, Brace and World in 1962; and The Contemporary Poet as Artist and Critic, published by Little, Brown Company in 1964.

The recipient of numerous awards and fellowships, Ostroff has lectured throughout the United States and Europe on education affairs and American Literature, and has taught at the University of California, Berkeley, University of Buffalo, and Vassar. He obtained his bachelor's degree from Northwest University in 1946 and his master's from the University of Michigan in 1949.

Sponsored by Eye-5, the Portland poet will spend three days in the South Puget Sound area working with students at Evergreen, St. Martin's College, Pacific Lutheran University and Olympia-area high schools.
