Warramore, Bain, Brady and Johansen of Seattle were named as architects to design science laboratories. Al Bumgardner of Seattle was appointed as the architect to design initial campus living quarters and residential food service facilities. And, Robert Price of Tacoma was retained to design the college's physical education building. All three firms were named subject to the satisfactory negotiation of fees for their work. The Board of Trustees earlier had named architects to design college library, large-group instruction and student activities facilities and had retained an engineering firm to draft site improvement plans. It is anticipated a landscape architect will be appointed in the near future. Work of the various firms is being coordinated by a design team leader, Robert Durham of the Seattle architectural firm of Durham, Anderson and Freed. In other action today, The Evergreen State College Board of Trustees: Named Trustee Janet Tourtellotte of Seattle to attend the April 20-22 meeting of the Association of Governing Boards in Columbia, Missouri. And, set April 12 as the date for the next board meeting.
