A collection of mirrors, all hand-decorated by artist Peggy Rosenblum of Portland, is now on display in the second floor reference section of The Evergreen State College Library and may be viewed by the public through August. There is no admission charge to view the exhibit.

The Evergreen Library is open from 9:00 a.m. to 6 p.m., Mondays and Thursdays; from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays; and from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Fridays during August.

The mirrors--of various sizes and shapes--range in style from ornate to plain and all have been embellished with beads, woven materials, and other fabrics.

Mrs. Rosenblum was born in 1939 in New York City. She took her bachelor of arts at Hunter College and attended the Brooklyn Museum Art School on a Beckman Scholarship. After earning a master of arts in painting at the University of California in Berkeley, she took a teaching position at Florida State University in Tallahassee with the department of art education.

The artist has traveled extensively--to India, Thailand, Cambodia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Japan, Iran, Turkey, Greece, Monaco, Egypt, Italy, Spain, England, France, Switzerland, Belgium, Haiti, Jamaica, Mexico, and Canada. Her work has been exhibited in numerous juried and invitational shows.

Mrs. Rosenblum currently works primarily with clay and mixed media objects.

Her exhibit at Evergreen was arranged by Faculty Member Kirk Thompson.
