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A Washington wire sculptor, Joe Police, will discuss his work and demonstrate his techniques in a half day presentation beginning at 2 p.m. January 29 in the main foyer of The Evergreen State College Library.

Police, who makes sculpture by fusing pieces of wire with an acetylene torch, lives on a 80-acre farm northwest of Washougal, where he has designed and built his own home using wire sculpture to create stairs and other features.

Presented by Eye-5, the sculptor will also be featured in the Mondays at Eight Series at Evergreen at 8 p.m., January 29 in the reference alcove of the library. He is also scheduled to appear at the Green Hill Correction Center in Chehalis from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. January 30; at St. Martin's College from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. January 31, at Fort Steilacoom Community College the afternoon of February 1, and at the Aberdeen Library from 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., February 2.

Police, whose works have circulated in art shows from Seattle to Los Angeles, teaches art at the Metropolitan Free School in Portland and also instructs some adult community groups.

His appearances are free and open to the public.
