A man who writes poems, makes the paper to print them on and publishes them with his own hand-operated printing press will demonstrate his skills at the Totem Service Club at Fort Lewis from 1 to 6 p.m. May 20.

Walter Hamady, owner of the Perishable Press Limited in Mt. Horeb, Wisconsin, will also appear at The Evergreen State College, Olympia, on the afternoon and evening of May 21.

A graduate of Wayne State University, Hamady is also an associate professor of art at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He set up his private press in 1964 and prints only original work.

Hamady selects or writes the manuscripts, makes the paper, sets the type, does the proofreading and sells the works to more than 80 private dealers, university and city libraries and other collectors.

The Wisconsin poet-printer-teacher is sponsored by Eye-5 and his appearances are free and open to the public.
