Board of Trustees Ex-Officio Member

On December 11, 1975, the Board of Trustees met and decided on the issue of exofficio members to the Board. The Coalition in May, 1975 requested to the Board and McCann to seat a member of the Third World Community at the Board of Trustees table. The Board and McCann, changing the language of the request voted in June 1975 to act on the request. The change in language of the request denied autonomous membership to the Board. At the December 11th meeting the Board refused to acknowledge Third World membership as autonomous under the justification of "no special interest group" shall be represented on the Board.

As it stands now, the Coalition Board will be deciding whether or not membership to the Board will be pursued any further.
