Two artists and a French language instructor have been appointed as new members of the faculty at The Evergreen State College, according to Vice President and Provost Edward J. Kormondy. All three appointments are effective September 15.

The new instructors are Susan Brenner, currently a painting, drawing and photography teacher in San Francisco; Marilyn Frasca, presently an Assistant Professor of Art at New England College, New Hampshire; and Susan Fiksdal of Olympia, who has been a parttime consultant in French language at Evergreen during the past year.

Ms. Brenner took a bachelor's degree in art from the University of California at Los Angeles in 1968 and a master's in painting from California State University at San Francisco in 1970. She has served as an art instructor for the San Francisco School District; the Daly City, California Recreation Department; the Brotherhood Way Center in San Francisco: and the San Francisco Jewish Community Center.

A student of graphics, drawing, and painting, Ms. Frasca received a bachelor's of fine arts degree from The San Francisco Art Institute in 1971 and a master's degree in arts from Bennington College, Vermont in 1964. She has taught art at New England College since 1967. Previously, she was an instructor at Bennington College and at Eastport High School in New York.

Mrs. Fiksdal received a bachelor's degree in French at Western Washington State College in 1969 and a master's degree in French at Middlebury College, Vermont in 1970. She also studied at U. de Toulouse-Bordeaux and U.d'Aix-Marseille in France for one year, receiving a diploma in languages in 1968. In addition to serving as a French language consultant at Evergreen during the 1972-73 academic year, she also has been a librarian at Forks, Washington and has been an employee in the Washington State Legislature.
