Mike and Alice Seeger, son and daughter-in-law of folksinger Pete Seeger and well known bluegrass musicians in their own right, will present a 7 p.m. concert and will play for a 9 p.m. square dance Feb. 13 at The Evergreen State College.

The man and wife team, scheduled to appear on the fourth floor of the Evans Library Building, have performed throughout the United States, New Zealand, Australia and Japan. They will sing and play Southern Appalachian-style music in the two performances, which are free and open to the public.

Also scheduled for a half-day workshop in Room 110 of the College Activities Building at 2:30 p.m., the two musicians will present a wide range of music from the oldest unaccompanied songs to the more modern sounds of contemporary Nashville, and some of their own compositions. Both play a variety of instruments including the banjo, guitar, harmonica, mandoline, autoharp, fiddle and spoons.

With more than 40 long playing record albums to their credit, the singing duo have performed at folk festivals across the nation and are scheduled for a month-long tour of England, Belgium, Switzerland, Germany, Holland and Sweden in the spring.
