The Second International Computer Film Festival held in Seattle the first of May has been captured on videotape and will be shown anew at The Evergreen State College May 15 and 16.

Festival organizer Richard Speer, an Evergreen senior from Bellevue, coordinated the three-day event at the University of Washington May 5, 6, and 7. He said hundreds of computer film fans attended the festival, which was cosponsored by Evergreen, the U. of W., Washington State Arts Commission, National Endowment for the Arts, Seattle Film Society, and the Computer Arts Society of the United States.

Throughout the three-day event in Seattle, every effort was made to videotape all of the speeches by internationally known computer film experts. Speer says those tapes, plus all the films and videotapes submitted for showing at the University, have been scheduled for showing at Evergreen Saturday and Sunday.

Videotapes of speeches and those by computer filmmakers will be screened from 4 to 6 p.m. both days in Lecture Hall Five. The actual computer films --- which were reviewed competively by festival judges --- will be shown from 8 to 11 each evening in Lecture Hall One.

Admission to the Evergreen showings is 50¢ for adults. Children are free and especially invited to attend.
