A cluster of one-man exhibits from Seattle's Henry Gallery are now on display in the main foyer of the Daniel J. Evans Library at The Evergreen State College.

Entitled "Master Crafts: Northwest Award Winners," the show includes work by four Pacific Northwest artists, and is an outgrowth of the 1971 competitive Northwest Craftsmen's show.

Included in the exhibit are jewelry done by Ramona Solberg, an associate professor at the University of Washington; weaving done by W. Ron Crosier, chairman of the art department at Adams High School in Portland, Oregon; sculpture by Richard Marquis, a Seattleite; and hand-blown glass and sculpture by Patrick McCormick, a faculty member at Western Washington State College.

The show, which will remain on exhibit through March 2, can be seen from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Mondays through Thursdays; from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Fridays; from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays and from I /o 10 p.m. on Sundays.
