
A word from the staff...





Native Americans/ Indians, Alaskan Natives, African Americans, Chicano/Latinos, Asian Americans/ Pacific Islanders and International Students, in recognition of our unique indigenous heritages.

Peer Support

Supervised by professional staff, these trained students provide advocacy, referral, academic and personal support during dropin hours, as well as workshops, Social/cultural events and outreach. Drop by and say hello in the Library 1407C. All contacts are confidential.

Mentoring Program
