The Evergreen State College-Community Music Ensembles will present two concerts April 17: a 4 p.m. performance at the Gloria Dei Lutheran Church on Olympia's Westside and an 8 p.m. presentation in the main lobby of the Evergreen Library Building.

The free public concerts will present a variety of classical compositions from the Baroque period, including works by Handel, Telemann, Bach, and an original piece by Evergreen Faculty Musician Dr. Greg Steinke. Called "Sketches," his piece for solo bass voice and oboe is based on texts from Shakespeare's "Twelfth Night."

Performing in the two Sunday events are Evergreen Faculty Members Donald Chan, harpsichord; Dr. William Winden, bass; Dr. Robert Gottlieb, viola; and Dr. Steinke, oboe. Also performing are community members Karla Timmerman, cello; Joan Winden, mezzo-soprano; and Louise Moon, flute.

The concerts are supported in part by grants from the Washington State Arts Commission, POSSCA, and Evergreen. The Sunday evening performance will be followed by a reception given by members of the Evergreen College Community Organization, in the Library 2100 lounge.

CHAMBER MUSIC CONCERT AND RECEPTION

ECCO is sponsoring a reception for the Evergreen College-Community Chamber Music Ensembles following their evening concert at the college on April 17th. We hope you will attend.

Sunday, April 17th, the Evergreen College-Community Chamber Music Ensembles will be presenting two concerts. A late afternoon performance will take place at 4:00 p.m. in the Gloria Dei church at westside Olympia. At 8:00 p.m. there will be a repeat of the same program at The Evergreen State College in the main lobby of the Library building. The program will consist of a variety of compositions from the Baroque period. Among the works to be performed will be a flute sonata by Handel, a viola sonata by Telemann, several arias by J.S. member Greg Steinke. Called "Sketches," this is for solo bass voice and oboe and is based on texts from Shakespeare's Twelfth Night.

The following members of the Evergreen faculty and the community will be performing: Louise Moon - flute, Greg Steinke - oboe, Robert Gottlieb - viola, Donald Chan - harpsichord, Joan Winden - mezzo soprano, William Winden - bass. The Continuo part for the various selections will be performed by Carla Timmerman on the cello.

#### OYSTER COMPANY TOUR, APRIL 27th

As the first "one-shot" activity of the season, ECCO is organizing a tour of Olympia Oyster Co. on Totten Inlet. The tour has been scheduled for 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 27th. Participants should meet at 12:15 p.m. in Parking Lot C on the Evergreen campus, at the end farthest from the campus plaza, and we'll make up car pools. (You'll have to pay 25¢ to park at Evergreen.)

Olympia Oyster Co. is one of a handful of oyster farming ventures that still commercially grows Olympia oysters, tiny native bivalves now found only in a few bays and inlets in southern Puget Sound between Olympia and Shelton. Once the Olympia oyster was the basis for a thriving industry that developed the most sophisticated oyster culture anywhere in the world. You'll hear about the growth and demise of Olympia oyster farming and a prognosis for the future. You'll see how they are "farmed" and processed as well as how the much larger Pacific oysters are handled. For further information, call Mary Ellen Benson, 866-2686.
