...EVERGREENER WINS SCHOLARSHIP TO NEW YORK COLLEGE...Arthur Rosenbaum of Seattle, a fourth-year student at Evergreen, has been awarded a \$4,000 scholarship to Bank Street School in New York City, one of the oldest graduate schools in the country. Rosenbaum, who will graduate in June, will pursue a master of arts in education at the New York school. A transfer from the University of Washington, Rosenbaum has studied philosophy at Evergreen. He also spent three months in Israel last year studying passivism and Judaism and prepared a multi-media presentation on his stay in Israel and his tour of European concentration camps.

...YOUNG ARTISTS DISPLAY WORKS IN EVERGREEN GALLERY...Art works by children in 13 Olympiaarea elementary schools will be exhibited in Evergreen's fourth floor library art gallery beginning Mar. 16. The exhibit, which will be on display for a month, will include works from both Tumwater and Olympia schools and is sponsored by the Evergreen Visual Environmental Board.

...PUB BOARD REQUESTS APPLICATIONS FOR STUDENT EDITOR...Evergreen's student newspaper, which has not been published since last June, is nearing a Spring Quarter publication date and the search is on for a student editor. The Publications Board, created by the Board of Trustees in February, called for applications for editor to be submitted by Mar. 14. The five-man board will appoint the editor Mar. 15 and begin immediately to draft a budget and appoint a business manager. Members of the Pub Board are <u>Greg Jones</u>, a student who has been named Board chairman; <u>Will Rice</u>, a student; <u>Sally Hunter</u>, assistant to the provost; Rudy Martin, faculty member; and <u>Sid Morrell</u>, former owner of the Lacey Leader.

...PROGRAM SELECTIONS MADE FOR 73-74 ACADEMIC YEAR...Program assignments for the 1973-74 academic year have been announced by Dean Merv Cadwallader, Eight basic and six advanced Coordinated Studies Programs are planned. In addition, about 15 faculty members will sponsor small group study contracts. Coordinated Studies are team-taught programs, usually involving 100 students and five faculty members from different academic fields. The various academic perspectives, using lectures, seminars, field work, group and individual projects, and reading and writing assignments as the foundations for their efforts. Group Contracted Studies feature one faculty member and a small number of students (10-20) working together on a specific academic assignment. Individual Contracts, typically available for advanced students, provide more intense opportunities for specific pursuit of career and/or academic interests.

...EVERGREENERS EXHIBIT PHOTOS IN SEATTLE...A group of 15 students from the Image and Idea Coordinated Studies program opened a month-long exhibit of some 40 black and white photos in the Salad Gallery in Seattle Mar. 4. The exhibit was organized by <u>Jack Slagle</u>, a Republic, Wash. student.

...SMORGASBORD OF ENTERTAINMENT SLATED FOR MARCH 12...Students from the Sound and Music section of the Image and Idea Coordinated Studies program and from the Evergreen group contract in dance will join forces Monday at 8 p.m. in the fourth floor cafeteria to present a concert of readings, music and dance. Coordinated by Faculty Members Bud Johanson and William Winden, the performance will include a reading of "The Londoner", a play by Dylan Thomas, a guitar duet, original songs performed by their composers, dances and a variety of electronic music. The concert is free and open to the public.
