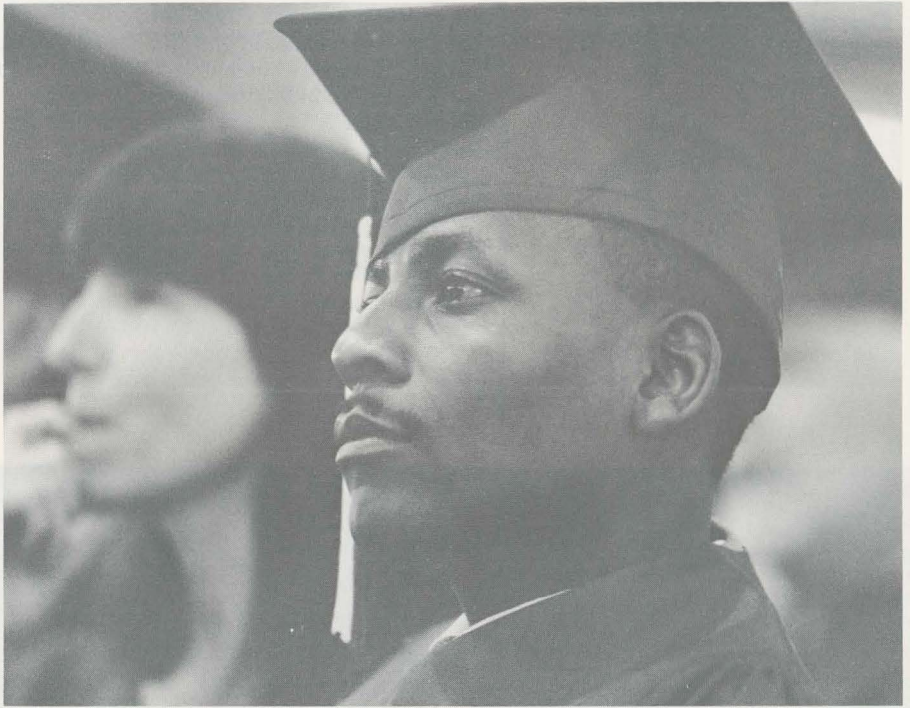

Evergreen is located in a 1,000-acre forest on the southern shore of Puget Sound between the Cascade Mountains and the Pacific Coast. Olympia, a seaport community of 30,000, with a small but expanding population of diverse ethnic groups, is only five miles away. As the state capital, Olympia offers many opportunities for governmental internships. Seattle, Tacoma and Portland are nearby, providing a variety of weekend activities as well as cultural ties to ethnic communities.

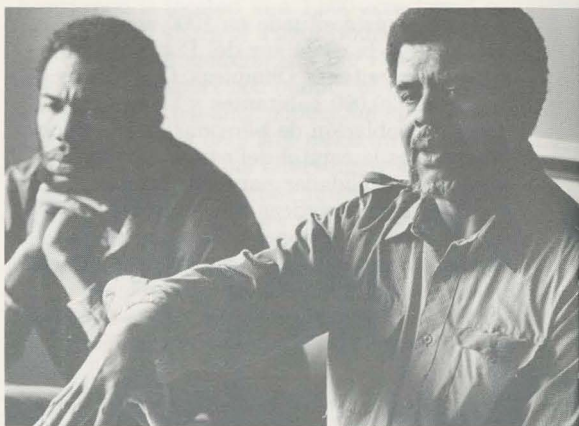

The Academic Program



Evergreen maintains a 20-to-1 student-to-faculty ratio and emphasizes learning in small groups rather than large lectures. Students develop close working relationships with faculty members, and receive credit from them by personally-written evaluations rather than letter grades. Evergreen's versatile curriculum is devoted to intercultural values. It enables you to study with an emphasis in most fields such as business, education, pre-law and pre-med, computer science and ethnic studies.

Evergreen's modes of study include full-time programs; part-time courses; individual learning contracts, where a student studies with one faculty member; and internships, where one can apply what one has learned in real world job settings. Full-time programs replace separate unrelated courses by combining a number of subjects in the study of a central issue or problem. Program activities may include:

- Lectures presented by faculty teams or guest speakers
- Seminars or group discussions among 15-20 students and one faculty member
- Laboratories
- Workshops
- Individual conferences with faculty members
- Field trips

For example, "Political Economy and Social Change" is a full-time interdisciplinary program that shows the relationships between history, economics, sociology, political science and law. Other typical interdisciplinary programs include "Society and the Computer," "Great Books," "Native American Studies," and "Counseling the Culturally Different."

Programas Académicos

Evergreen mantiene una proporción de 20 estudiantes por cada profesor. Hacemos énfasis en la enseñanza en grupos pequeños mejor que en conferencias de grandes grupos. Los estudiantes y los profesores trabajan juntos y a través de estos trabajos se llegan a conocer muy bien. En lugar de notas o calificaciones, los profesores escriben cartas de evaluación con lujo de detalles acerca del trabajo que cada estudiante ha hecho. El plan de estudio incluye una perspectiva intercultural y permite estudiar varias disciplinas tales como: negocios, certificado para la enseñanza primaria o secundaria, computadoras electrónicas, estudios preparatorios para continuar una carrera en leyes o medicina, y estudios interculturales.

Evergreen ofrece varios planes de estudio, por ejemplo: oportunidades para los estudiantes que quieren estudiar tiempo completo o por horas trimestrales, oportunidades para estudio individual basado en un contrato entre un profesor y un estudiante, y oportunidades de hacer prácticas en agencias públicas o privadas. Los programas académicos reemplazan el estudio de cursos individuales sin relación el uno al otro. Estos programas combinan varios ramos académicos para estudiar un tema central. Las actividades del programa pueden incluir:

- Conferencias presentadas por miembros de la facultad u otros expertos.
- Participación en reunión de estudiantes para discutir y analizar problemas y diferentes puntos de vista.
- Ejecutar experimentos en los laboratorios.
- Entrevista con los profesores.
- Excursiones.

Por ejemplo, "Political Economy and Social Change" es un programa cuyo tema central demuestra la relación entre la historia, la economía, la sociología, la ciencia política, y la ley. Otros programas interdisciplinarios incluyen "Society and the Computer," "Native American Studies," and "Counseling the Culturally Different."

Freshman

Normally, any graduate in the upper half of the graduating class of an accredited high school will be considered for admission. If their rank is not available, applicants will be considered individually.

If you are not in the upper half of your class, you will need to show evidence of your ability to succeed at Evergreen by submitting test scores, letters of recommendation and other data as requested by the Admissions Office. Commonly submitted test scores include the Washington Pre-College Test, Scholastic Aptitude Test or American College Test. At this time, no minimum score is required.

Transfer Students

If you are a transfer student, you will be considered for admission if you made satisfactory progress at your previous college and left in good academic standing. Applicants from other institutions who have completed 45 or more quarter hours of college-level credit (or the equivalent), need not submit high school transcripts or test scores. Those who have completed less than 45 quarter hours must submit high school transcripts as well as college transcripts.

General Educational Development Tests

Applications will be considered from persons 18 or older who have not graduated from an accredited high school, but have completed the General Educational Development (GED) tests. Normally, GED test scores should be at the 60th percentile or above in all categories.

Application Deadlines

Evergreen has a "rolling admissions" process. This means that the college reviews applications as they are completed (when official transcripts are received for evaluation) and returns decisions within a few weeks. The college may stop accepting applications if enrollment limits are reached. It is to your advantage to consider the following guidelines when applying:

Fall Quarter, 1989—December 1

Winter and Spring Quarter, 1990—February 1

Admission to The Evergreen State College is granted without regard to race, color, national origin, sex or physical challenge.



Freshmen

Normalmente, todos los candidatos que tienen su título de escuela secundaria cuyas notas lo ponen en la primera mitad de los graduados en su clase serán admitidos a Evergreen. Si la escuela secundaria no determina el puesto del candidato, el candidato será evaluado de acuerdo a sus méritos personales. Si usted no está en la primera mitad de los graduados de su escuela secundaria, será necesario que usted demuestre evidencia que usted podrá salir bien en los estudios universitarios de Evergreen. Esta evidencia puede consistir de cartas de recomendación de maestros, notas del SAT, ACT, o WPCT, etc.

Transfer students

Los candidatos que han estudiado en otras universidades serán admitidos a Evergreen si sus certificados muestran que sus notas son aceptables, usualmente un promedio de 2.00. Candidatos de otras universidades que han acumulado 40 créditos universitarios no necesitan someter el certificado de escuelas secundaria o las notas del SAT, ACT, o WPCT.

General Education Development Tests

Candidatos que no se graduaron de una escuela secundaria y que tienen 18 años de edad o más, pero pasaron el GED con un porcentaje de 60 o mejor en cada uno de los exámenes serán considerados para entrar a Evergreen.

Application Deadlines

Evergreen procesará las planillas de los candidatos tan pronto como todos los documentos requeridos sean recibidos en la Oficina de Admisiones, y esta oficina notificará a los candidatos dentro de pocas semanas. Tan pronto como Evergreen llegue a su meta de estudiantes, no aceptará más planillas de estudiantes que quieran entrar a la universidad. Le aconsejamos que mande su planilla el primero de Diciembre para el Fall Quarter de 1989, y el primero de Febrero para el Winter o el Spring Quarter, 1990. Los candidatos son admitidos sin distinción alguna en relación a raza, nacionalidad, sexo, o desventaja física.

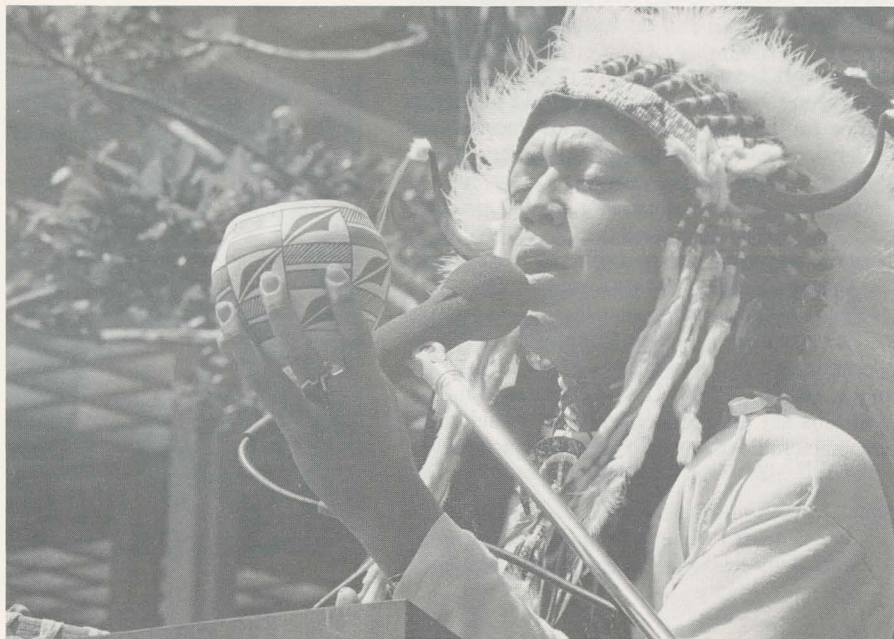
You should mail your Financial Aid Form to the College Scholarship Service no later than March 1 so it will be processed and meet Evergreen's deadline of April 15.

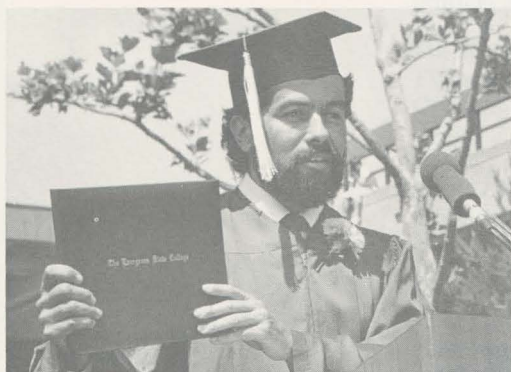

Educational Support Services

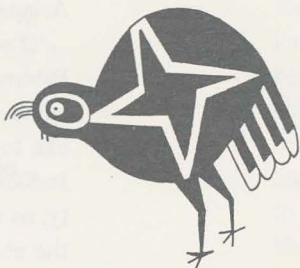
Evergreen provides services to students in support of both their educational and personal needs.

The First Peoples Advising Services works with all minority students, faculty and staff on campus. Their goal is to aid students in their successful completion of a college degree. Services include a monthly newsletter about campus activities and community services; a study/typing room and a library lounge area; fall orientation activities for new First People students; peer advising, information, referral and limited counseling on a walk-in basis; and sponsorship of films, dances, workshops and events in cooperation with First Peoples student organizations, which are listed on page 18.

Academic Advising provides students with current information about academic programs.

KEY—Keep Enhancing Yourself is a program designed to enhance the retention, academic success and graduation rate of eligible students. KEY works closely with Financial Aid, Career Development and other campus offices, in addition to conducting workshops, individual and group counseling sessions.

The **Writing Center** offers individual help to improve reading, writing and study skills.



Servicios de asistencia educativa



Evergreen ofrece servicios para ayudar a los estudiantes con su educación, y sus necesidades personales.

The First Peoples Advising Services trabaja con todos los estudiantes, profesores y empleados de la minoría. Esta organización tiene como objeto ayudar a los estudiantes en sus esfuerzos para obtener el título universitario. Parte de sus servicios incluyen un periódico mensual que contiene las actividades y servicios que se ofrecen en esta universidad; cuarto de estudio con máquina de escribir, una biblioteca; una serie de actividades culturales y sociales durante el otoño para los nuevos estudiantes; consejeros para ayuda educacional o personal; películas, bailes, talleres, y otros eventos en cooperación con otras organizaciones estudiantiles las cuales aparecen en la pagina 19.

The Writing Center ofrece ayuda para los que necesitan mejorar la composición, la gramática, la lectura y los hábitos de estudiar.

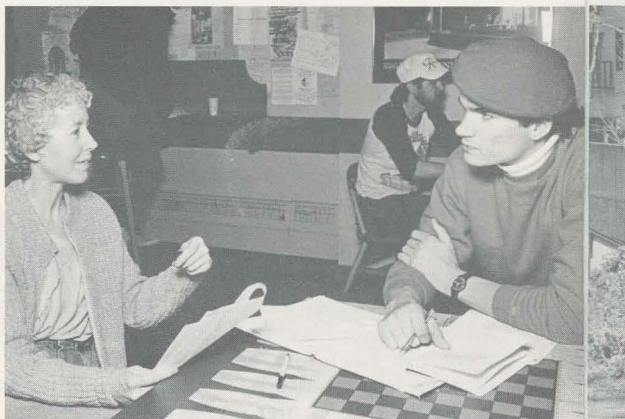

On-campus housing includes 19 duplexes and 12 residence halls which contain one- to five-person apartments. Students have full kitchen facilities in all but the smallest apartments, or they may buy meals at the cafeteria or the Campus Deli. One of the halls has an international floor where students join in a multicultural living experience.

Although it isn't owned by the college or in any way a part of the housing system, ASH (or Adult Student Housing) is the off-campus housing closest to Evergreen. To contact the 170-unit ASH complex, call (206) 866-8181. Other rentals are available throughout the Olympia area.

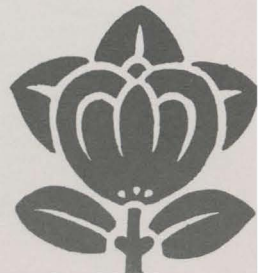
