Professional science education workshops, distinguished visiting lecturers, special displays and exhibits, tours, and a dedication ceremony all will be featured May 13-15 when The Evergreen State College formally opens its arts and sciences Laboratory Building to public view.

The building first opened in late 1973 with completion of the initial phase of construction, was expanded with completion of an annex, and then was doubled in size when workmen finished second-phase facilities in late 1975. The building now totals 178,927 square feet of space devoted to flexible academic facilities for both general and highly-specialized science and arts instruction.

Dedication ceremonies, with Evergreen President Charles J. McCann presiding, are scheduled to begin at 11:00 a.m. May 14 in a landscaped courtyard outside the L-shaped building. Featured speakers during the brief program will include Evergreen Board of Trustees member Janet Tourtellotte and former trustee Trueman L. Schmidt.

A Workshop for College and High School Chemistry Teachers will run throughout the day on May 14, followed by a Workshop for College Biology Teachers on May 15.

Distinguished visiting lecturers include Dr. Michael Scriven, philosopher of science from the University of California at Berkeley, and Peter S. Stevens, Director of the Architectural Planning Office at Harvard University Medical School.

Dr. Scriven will discuss "The Two Noncultures" Inhumane Humanities and Unscientific Sciences" during a free public lecture at 8:00 p.m. May 13 in Auditorium One of the Evergreen Lecture Halls Building. Stevens, an architect, planner, author and artist, will deliver a free public illustrated talk on "Patterns in Nature", starting at 8 p.m. May 14

The three-day open house and dedication program was organized by Evergreen faculty member Dr. Donald Humphrey, a biologist and former academic dean who coordinated the development of science programs and facilities at the state's newest public four-year college.
