Registration for more than twenty Summer Quarter programs at The Evergreen State College begins May 19, according to Evergreen Academic Dean Dr. Charles Teske.

Registration will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays through May 28, with one final "walk-in" registration day set for the first day of Summer Quarter classes, June 28.

Dr. Teske says Evergreen's 1976 summer program offers 20 group contracts, usually involving one faculty member and approximately 20 students in each, and one coordinated studies program, taught by two instructors for up to 40 students. In addition, some 18 faculty members have been assigned to offer individualized instruction in a variety of subject areas ranging from business, education and economics to literature, psychology and visual and performing arts.

Summer programs vary in length from ten weeks to three and a half weeks, but all of them begin June 28. Dr. Teske says programs generate from one to four units of Evergreen credit (equivalent to four quarter hours), depending on the length and type of programs students select.

Offerings for Summer 1976 include: Intensive Russian Language Studies, Basic Mathematics and Computer Science, "Bring Her Back Alive: Herstory Out of the Books Onto the Stage," Ceramics, Elements of Design, The Epic, Field and Laboratory Studies in Animal Behavior, "First Things First," "The Image of Ethnic Minorities in Contemporary Drama," "Medieval and Renaissance Museums and Monuments: Travels in Europe," Natural History of Washington's Marine Coasts, Organic Gardening, An Overview of American Folk Music, "Squashblossom II," Theatre Performance and the Senior Citizen, Undergraduate Major in Psychology, "Viva La Revolucion," Women in Management, "Words, Images and Magic," and "Writing- Places."
