The life and works of potter/teacher Cynthia Bringle are the topic of a free videotape presentation at The Evergreen State College March 3. The presentation, part of the continuing Contemporary Craftsmen Lecture Series, begins at 7:30 p.m. in Lecture Hall Five.

Rated as one of the nation's top pottery teachers Bringle offers a summer program at the Penland, North Carolina School of Crafts, where she operates her own independent studio. She is a production potter, whose background in painting has provided her with an unusual combination of skills, knowledge and techniques.

A seasoned lecturer, Bringle has offered pottery workshops throughout the country and is scheduled to conduct an april program--sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts--at Fort Wright College in Spokane.

The videotape on Bringle's life and works has been arranged for Evergreen by Faculty Ceramicist Peggy Dickinson, coordinator of the Winter Quarter academic program on Contemporary Craftsmen in America. The presentation is free and open to the public.
