Students in the Latin America Studies Group at The Evergreen State College (in Olympia) are presenting a Northwest Symposium on Chile Friday, January 25, and Saturday, January 26.

The Symposium--first of its kind in the Northwest--is designed to provide a comprehensive academic treatment of a recent major international event--the overthrow and death of Chilean President Salvador Allende. Symposium events will include lectures, panel discussions, small workshops, movies, and cultural activities.
