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Two buildings at The Evergreen State College have won recognition in the 1974 Honor Awards Program of the Southwest Washington Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

One structure—the College Recreation Center designed by the Tacoma architectural firm of Robert Price and Associates—received an Honor Award for distinguished accomplishment in architecture.

The other--the college's Central Utilities Plant designed by Bennett, Johnson, Slenes and Smith, Architects of Olympia--received a Merit Award.

Program entrees were not only judged on the basis of competition but also on the architect's solution to the design problem presented, as well as a project's worthiness for an architectural award of excellence.

The selection jury included Gerald Williams, Seattle architect; Keith Kolb, Seattle architect and Associate Professor in the College of Architecture and Urban Planning at the University of Washington; Reider Dittman, U of W architectural student; and Saul Zaik, Portland architect.

Evergreen building project work--from design to construction and operation--is coordinated by the college's Director of Facilities, Jerry L. Schillinger.
