Registration of persons interested in Winter Quarter part-time study at The Evergreen State College will be held from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., January 2 in the office of Admissions Director David Brown.

Space is available for 180 to 190 part-time students, Brown said.

Part-time students may register for one unit of Evergreen credit, or the rough equivalent of a five-hour program of studies elsewhere.

Three programs, all designed especially for part-time students, will have 40 openings each. In addition, there are openings for 20 part-time students in two Coordinated Studies programs; 16-22 openings in six Group Contracts; and 24-29 openings in Individual Contracted Studies.

The special large-group programs are entitled The Future: Awareness and Alternatives; The Nature of Man; and The Ocean. The Future program will meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings and will deal with current and coming issues with respect to social, political, environmental, and technological change.

The Nature of Man program will include a set of ten lectures followed by discussion sessions conducted by various members of the faculty. Topics will include man's psycho-biological, socio-political, and artistic-creative being. The group will meet on Wednesdays, from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

The Ocean program will meet on Wednesday evenings and will include ten lectures on the characteristics of the ocean and its role in weather, food production, etc.

Limited openings are available in the Evergreen Environment, Studies in History and Culture, Art, Experimental Structures, Urban Planning, and Music Group Contracts, which

are part of Evergreen's regular 1972-73 academic year programs.

And, some Individual Contracts will be available in such areas of study as metal sculpture; biology; philosophy; the Bible; literature; chemistry; languages; German, Russian, and Italian Literature; and political science.
