A 6 o'clock news show which features a community service bulletin is the first regularly scheduled program on KAOS, the campus radio station at The Evergreen State College.

Dean Katz, student station manager, said the 10-watt station went into fulltime operation January 8 and can now be heard at 89.3 on the FM dial from 5:30 p.m. to midnight weekdays and from 4 p.m. to midnight weekends.

Contributions to the community service bulletin are requested by Katz who said, "everything of a public nature will be aired if we receive it before 3 p.m. on the day of or the day before the event." No commercial announcements will be used.

Located in the College Activities Building, the station can be heard throughout much of the Olympia area, from South Bay to Tumwater, Shelton to Nisqually. "We're really surprised at the distance our signal is traveling," Katz said, "and we're pleased to have such a large listening area."

Working with a staff of about 25 students, Katz said he is currently experimenting with program scheduling and hopes to have a detailed program plan by February 1.
