James O. Johnson, currently a Systems Analyst at the University of Washington, will assume a similar position at The Evergreen State College on April 8, according to Robert Barringer, Director of Computer Services at the new institution in Olympia.

He is the first of several computer-oriented persons expected to be employed at the college in the next several months.

Johnson, 23, will be involved with general planning for Evergreen's Computer Services Department and will devote special attention to the development of student information systems, including student recruiting, admissions, registration, scheduling and academic records, Barringer said.

While there he participated not only in systems work but also in project management in the development and operation of a complex student information program.
