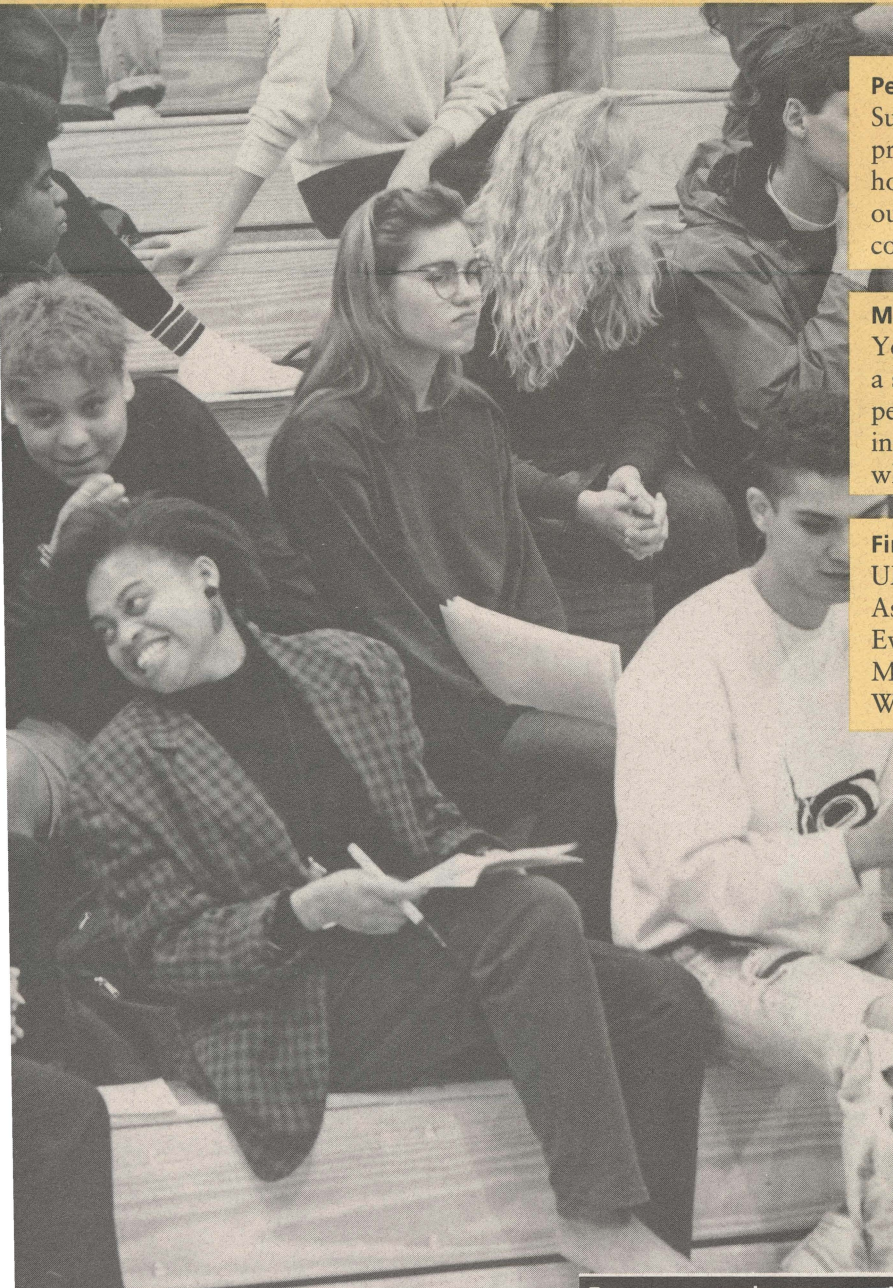

Peer Support

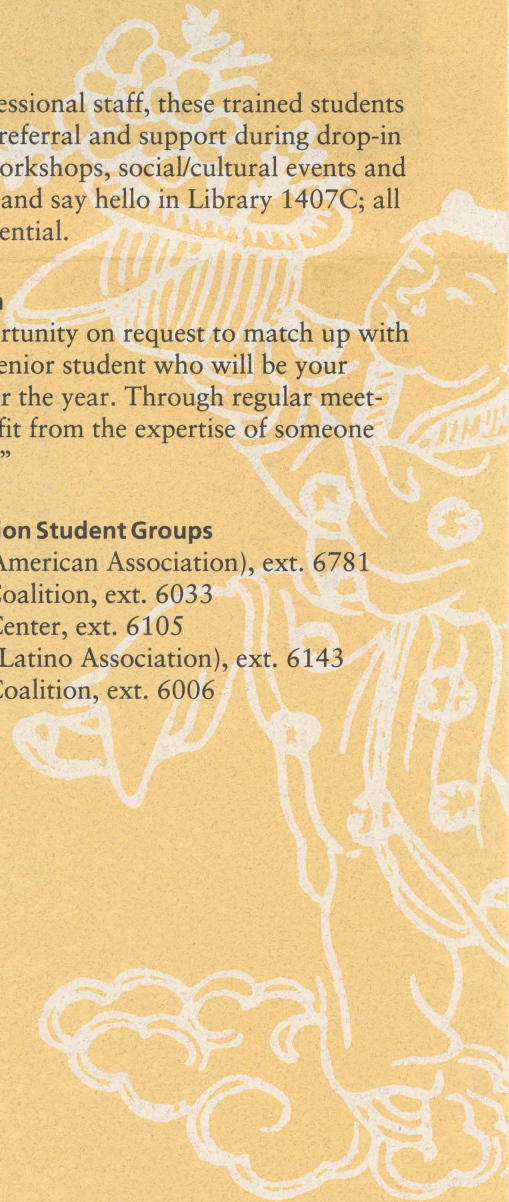

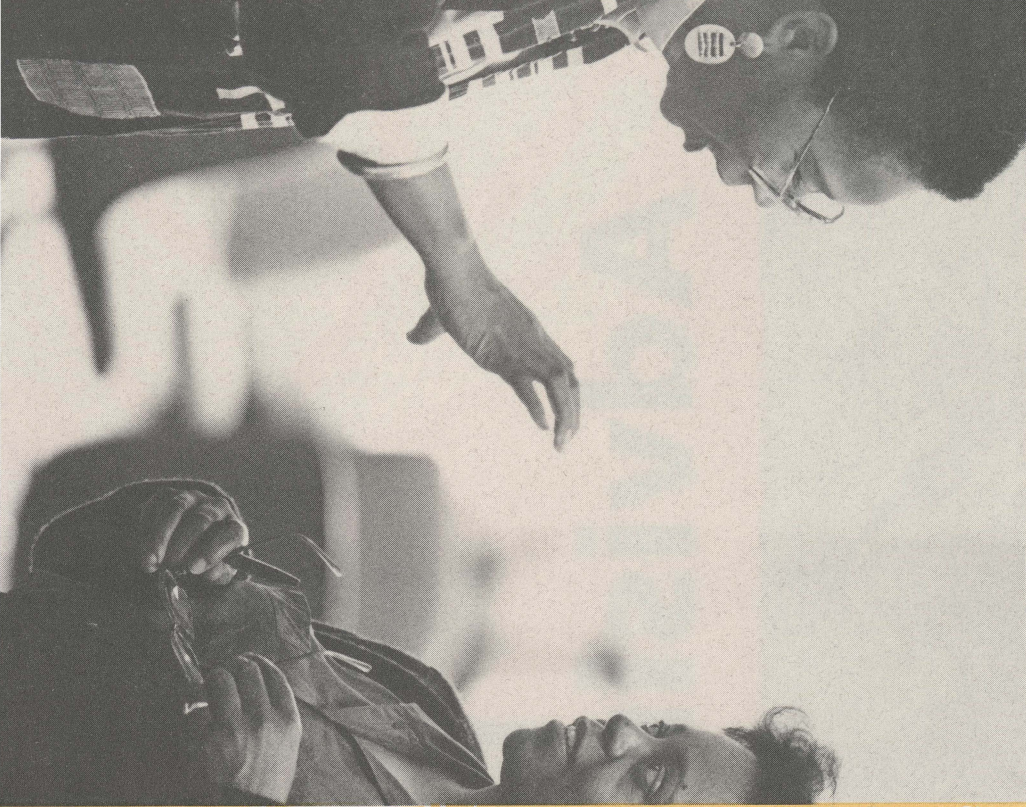
Mentoring Program
