Beryl L. Crowe, an Assistant Professor of Political Science at Oregon State University, will assume a similar position at The Evergreen State College at Olympia on September 1, 1970, it was announced today by Evergreen Vice President and Provost David G. Barry.

Crowe, 45, is the eighth senior faculty member appointed to help plan curricula in the year prior to the start of classes at Washington's newest public four-year college.

"Mr. Crowe comes to Evergreen with very high recommendations as a student of political science and as a national leader in the analysis of social and political problems as they relate to man and his environment," Barry Said. "His article The Tragedy of the Commons Revisited, printed in the November, 1969 issue of Science Magazine and in which he sets forth the problems we face in approaching environmental planning and pollution control, has brought him national recognition in this rapidly developing area of public concern."

After spending ten years at sea as a merchant radio operator, Crowe enrolled at San Francisco State College in 1955 as a student of government, receiving his bachelor's degree in 1959. He received his master's degree in Political Science from the University of California in 1961 and currently is completing work on his Ph.D.

Dick Nichols, Director Information Services Crowe entered teaching in 1964 as an Assistant Professor of Political Science at San Francisco State College, remaining there until assuming a similar position at Oregon State University in 1966.

Prior to joining the faculty at San Francisco State College, he received a 1962-63 Falk Research Fellowship at the Institute of Governmental Studies at Berkeley, California, and a 1964 Falk Political Party Internship with the California State Democratic Central Committee.

While at Oregon State University Crowe received Institutional Research Grants in 1966 and 1969 and a National Science Foundation Undergraduate Instructional Grant in 1968.

He is a member of the American Political Science Association, American Sociological Association, Western Political Science Association, and Northwest Scientific Association. He has authored two books -- "American Political Parties: A Systemic Perspective," published by Harper and Rowe in 1967; and "Introduction to Political Science: An Invitation to the Discipline," in process of publication by American Book Company. His publications also include a number of articles on political processes and government.

Crowe and his wife Natalie are the parents of one child, Beryl Daniel, 10.
