Residents of the areas adjacent to Totten and Skookum Inlets will be asked by students at The Evergreen State College to fill out a brief questionnaire Tuesday and Wednesday (April 26 and 27).

Sponsored by the Thurston and Mason County Planning Departments, the Evergreen students are conducting a survey on the uses of waters and lands of and around Totten Inlet. They will distribute questionnaires door to door to randomly selected homes located within a half mile of the two inlet shorelines. They will also mail questionnaires to landowners and seasonal residents.

The Evergreen study emphasizes the relationship between the growth of residential areas and the future of local aquaculture industries. Students will use the questionnaire to determine how local residents use the inlets, how they would like to see the area developed, and what their attitudes are toward aquaculture.

Results of the questionnaire and the students' study will be presented to both county planning departments and the public in June.
