Native speakers of The Mandarin Chinese Dialect are being sought by The Evergreen State College to participate in a unique year-long academic program.

Faculty Member Paul Marsh, coordinator of the "Chinese Civilization" Coordinated Studies Program, says the academic study will seek to "introduce a complete view of Chinese civilization in a historical context."

Key to success of the program, which will culminate with a year's study in Taiwan during the 1975-76 academic year, is the help of native Mandarin speakers to serve as tutors to some 60 Evergreen undergraduates.

The tutors, who will be paid for their services, will be asked to work with groups of four students on weekday afternoons or evenings. "Faculty members and tutors will also rely on Chinese texts, tapes, and diagnostic testing to help students master the rudiments of Chinese language", Marsh said.
