A color slide and musical visit to the island of Hvar, Yugoslavia will be presented January 21 by Dr. Mervyn L. Cadwallader as part of the "Wednesday Evening Lecture Series" running through Winter and Spring Quarters at The Evergreen State College.

The program, "The Lions of Hvar", is open to the public free of charge and will begin promptly at 8:00 p.m. in Auditorium One of the Evergreen Lecture Halls Building.

Dr. Cadwallader, a member of the Evergreen faculty, says the multi-media presentation reflects "one man's love affair with a beautiful island in the Adriatic Sea, off the Dalmation Coast".

A sociologist and historian, Dr. Cadwallader has traveled extensively and is an accomplished photographer. He spends his summers on Hvar, reflecting, writing, and recording on film and tape the many moods of the fascinating island. The dazzling photography and the sounds of the island, coupled with the narrator's deep personal feelings for Hvar, make the presentation the kind one might expect from a National Geographic travelogue.

Dr. Cadwallader came to Evergreen in 1970 as an academic dean, spearheading the development of team-taught Coordinated Studies as a core of the college's academic program. He completed a three-year term in that assignment in 1973 and then became a full-time member of the faculty.

Prior to joining Evergreen, he served as a top academic officer at State University of New York's College at Old Westbury and as Coordinator of Tutorials in Letters and Science at San Jose State College, California. He also has been an instructor at Pratt Institute, University of Oregon, Old Westbury and San Jose.

Dr. Cadwallader received his bachelor's and master's degrees in history from the University of Nebraska and his doctorate in sociology from the University of Oregon.
